I hope that the High Holidays were meaningful for everyone.

As you know, we implemented communal dining on Friday, September 19, 2020. The Residents appear to be enjoying their time together. We continue to maintain all precautions as indicated in my previous letter of September 18<sup>th</sup> which include recommendations and guidance from CDC, Department of Health, and OSHA.

Given the positive response from the residents, we have decided to expand our communal dining for all residents (in split sessions), to include Friday evening dinner as well as Saturday lunch.

In addition to communal dining and extending the invitation to family/loved ones to attend services and Rabbi Bryan's outdoor discussion group, we are now in the initial planning stages to resume limited indoor group activities. Of course, this will include an environment that ensures safety, social distancing, and the adherence to all precautions to prevent any potential transmission.

Jackie Kott is no longer with Stein Assisted Living as the Director of Activities. We are thankful for the commitment Jackie demonstrated over the years and wish her well in all her future endeavors. Joan Brennan, has agree to act as the Interim Director of Recreation.

### **There is a Change in Outside Trips Effective Monday October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020.**

You may have heard that NJ is experiencing an increase in newly diagnosed COVID 19 cases. This includes increasing cases at surrounding Long Term Care and Assisted Living Residences. In light of this situation I have met with our management team and we will be curtailing "Non –Essential" outside trips. We will provide transportation to Medically Necessary appoints, via Wilf Transport, at no cost. This is to ensure the safety of our community. 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While we cannot stop a family member /POA from transporting the resident in their own car, we strongly recommend that the resident be transported by Wilf Transport.

If a family member/POA chooses to transport the resident in their own vehicle to a medically necessary appointment and/or any other outside activity, the resident will be required to quarantine for 10 days upon return to their apartment. Please understand, our intention is to keep your loved one and our community safe.

Again, below are the guidelines for attendance at services and discussion groups

Maximum of 2 individuals attending per resident.

Please call the Receptionist at 732-568-1155 to schedule your attendance at services.

Services on Saturday (outside) from 10:30 -12:00 and the Torah discussion group from 3pm-4pm

Visitors are required to undergo COVID-19 screening upon arrival.

- Residents and visitors/individuals must wear a KN95 mask at all times. If you do not have the proper mask, one will be provided for you upon arrival.
- Social distancing (minimum of 6 feet) **must be maintained at all times.**
- No physical contact between residents and individuals is permitted. This includes, but is not limited to, hugging, kissing, hand holding and all other forms of physical contact.
- Any visitor diagnosed with COVID-19, under investigation for COVID-19, with a temperature above 99 degrees Fahrenheit, with chills, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, sore throat, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, or who traveled from a designated COVID-19 "hot spot" within the past 14 days will not be permitted to visit and/or attend services.
- We strongly urge you not to share food/drink. Visitors may bring items for the resident but must leave the package with reception. Visitors may bring their own drinks but may not share them with the resident. Hydration will be provided for the residents by the facility.



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- Visitors will not be permitted into the building beyond the reception area and restrooms will not be available to visitors.

We understand that visiting with your loved one is important for everyone. At the same time our goal is to keep your loved one and the entire community safe.
